

Course Content

What is the course content and structure?

The one year full-time course is spread over four trimesters. The taught component of the course is covered during the first three trimesters starting in August every year. The fourth trimester is assigned to undertake and complete research or project of your own interest and passion.

The course structure comprises five distinct, yet overlapping, strands of teaching and learning: Theory, Practical, Skills, Masterclass and Continuing Professional Development (CPD).

The course will be taught in combination of lectures, hands-on working sessions, workshops, focused discussions, seminars and tutorials. All modules and classes are mandatory for students who register for the course. There will be certain modules, masterclasses and CPD courses that will open to the external participants at a nominal charge. The end term will focus on individual research or project wherein your own research skills or project competence will be nurtured. As part of the 'placement' or 'professional training' module, you could work alongside a heritage professional or organisation and gain valuable practical exposure of working in the field.
